People have lived in Drayton Bassett since at least 1100 AD as we learnt from 1980's building excavations when remains of a moated house were uncovered. For many, Drayton Bassett is principally known as the village of Sir Robert Peel (1788-1850), the Prime Minister who introduced the police force or "Bobbies" to Britain and whose resting place is in the vault at St Peter's Church.

It is also known as being next door to Drayton Manor Theme Park, one of the countries major amusement parks built on the site of Sir Roberts former home, Drayton Manor.

But those who have chosen to come to live in a small village, rather than in a large urban area, will want to know about community life, amenities and activities. The village population at the 2021 Census was 1075 and includes a rich blend of residents; old and new housing and the outlying farming area which gives the district much of its character.

There is a strong sense of community here which we hope you will become an active part of and that you find the practical information in this booklet provided by the parish council, useful to you.

SCHOOLS

Manor Primary Academy

A school was established by Lady Julia Peel, the wife of the Prime Minister in 1830 for the poor children of the village and housed in Old School Row. In 1905 this was replaced by a public elementary school, now Manor Primary Academy. It is a small friendly school located in heart of our delightful village. The school caters for around 100 pupils of ages 3-11, including a small Nursery. There is wraparound care available, with before and after school clubs.

The school converted to academy status in 2022 and joined the local Fierté MAT. It is committed to working closely as a trust to develop the best possible learning for all children in all their schools.

With 4 classrooms, plus a Nursery class, the school is organised into mixed-age classes: 'Robins' are Nursery and Reception class; 'Swans' are Year 1 and 2; 'Owls' are Year 3 and 4 and 'Penguins' are Year 5 and 6. Reception year is typically oversubscribed with applications.

The school enjoys very supportive Governors, staff and parents, which contribute to a happy, safe and secure environment. Every child is valued as an individual, is recognised for their unique talents and accepted for who they are. Learners are happy, motivated, capable, enthusiastic, well-behaved children and are willing and eager to learn.

The Church tower, dating from 1300's, was commissioned by Ralph Lord Bassett. The rest of the building was replaced in 1790's by the first Sir Robert Peel. It was enlarged later in memory of the famous Sir Robert Peel who died in 1850 and is entombed here.

Today the church still thrives, with a warm friendly atmosphere. It is part of the Peel Group of Parishes with Rev Jonathan Iddon as minister and the help of excellent lay readers and clergy.
