	Staffordshire County Councillor (Cllr Alex Farrell) replied to the comment regarding reducing the village speed to 40mph. Staffs Highways require proof it's needed via a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) which can take 12-18 months. This is a long and costly exercise involving consultation with residents and businesses.
	Clear evidence is required that people are breaking the speed limit with an 8 percentile.
	Suggested VAS signs either permanent or portable which could be moved to ho spots.
	The mention that could HS2 pay for this, any infrastructure changes would also gethrough a TRO
	Hedges – Drayton Lane, possibly the responsibility of the landowner, he suggeste photographic evidence to be uploaded and reported on the SCC app.
	Salts Lane – corner erosion by HGV's, need to ascertain who owns this corner, if it SCC they will repair.
	Footpath in Salts Lane, the only way would be to land grab to the right.
	Moat Drive car parking issues is a Police matter.
